## Bon View Kids are Can-Do Kids

A big pillar of our philosophy here at Bon View is empowering children to take care of themselves and their belongings. When children are Can-Do Kids they grow in self-esteem, independence and most importantly CONFIDENCE! As parents, you too, can encourage your children to be Can-Do Kids and help them grow in confidence. Here are a few tips:

### 1. Let Them Make Decisions

When your child gets to make choices from a young age, they will gain confidence in their own judgment. Of course, kids love to run the show and having too much control can be overwhelming. It is best to give them 2 options to choose from: For example: instead of asking what they want for lunch ask if they would like pasta or a sandwich for lunch. This gives them a choice, but also keeps the parent in charge.

### 2. Don't Rescue Your Child

"Kids get the most out of what they can accomplish for themselves. Sometimes that means standing by as our kids struggle to complete a task we could easily help them with or do for them." (from Parenting with Love and Logic). It is natural to want to help your child, but when you intervene –helping put their coat/shoes on, unpacking their tote bag, etc.—you are taking away their chance for practicing an important skill and gaining confidence while doing it. It can be hard when you are in a hurry, but try to allow your child the time to master these skills on their own.

### 3. Support Healthy Risks

Encourage your child to explore, try new things and stretch out of their comfort zone. For example: trying bigger playground equipment, or carrying their own plate to the dishwasher, etc. New experiences increase their confidence and embolden children to try even more new things. Preschoolers are resilient and can do lots of things when given the chance!

The flip side, of course, of having choices and taking risks is that sometimes your child will make mistakes. This is a good thing. Perfection is not the goal. Children have to make mistakes to learn how to be successful the next time. So let mistakes happen and know that it means you are letting your child grow.
